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Preferred Option G Linthouse Lane/Kitchen Lane

This land in South Staffs is right on the edge of the border to Wednesfield, so it will impact fully on those who live in and around that particular area, which is the only stretch of greenbelt in the Wednesfield, to lose this breath of fresh air would be a tragedy, especially for us locals that use the area for walking, chilling out and enjoying the diverse wildlife we have in that area such as the fox, [REDACTED], brown hare, rabbits, and an abundance of songbirds, finches and buzzards not forgetting various types of bat.

The local infrastructure hasn't been thought of fully as to how the extra traffic is going to be dealt with when almost 2000 extra households will be using it, as well as the other amenities in the area especially the Dr's surgeries and New Cross hospital both bursting at the seams at the moment - no mention of increasing the Dr's surgeries or Secondary education?? these are both very important to this area we deserve to be able to access these amenities better than we do at the moment with extra household's in the pipeline how is that going to happen?

We do not need anymore shopping facilities there are empty shops in Wednesfield high street that need occupying, we have a park already on Ashmore Park with a cycle race track and BMX trail and sports facilities at Coppice Secondary school.

This land has been used as an arable farm for years, which helps with climate change and supplying the local food chain, surely we are supposed to be encouraging such farms not turning them into concrete jungles, I am not against new homes but I feel brownfield should be explored first and existing housing as there were reports only last year of hundreds of houses standing empty for years!

Listening and reading the comments regarding these plans it's stated that its better to have a plan than not, why is this? as if a building company puts in plans to the council surely the plans can be looked at individually to see if they are suitable and needed in that particular area??

This land also has a long and interesting history from Anglo Saxon times and is likely to be rich in archaeological artefacts.
