Figures taken from CPRE Staffordshire:

*2021 Census shows 9,000 fewer households in the Black Country than is being considered in the BCP

*Projections suggest this could rise to 15000 fewer households over the length of the plan

*WMCA says there is significantly more brownfield land available than previously thought. CPRE estimates this could be enough to supply between 5,000 and 12,000 homes

* Birmingham Plan. Between 2017 and 2020 additional supply increased by 27%, almost 14,000 homes. If this is the case then...

*The Black Country's claim of a shortfall of 28,000 homes could be wildly exaggerated
