#### **Employment Land requirements and supply**

Dudley MBC considers the policy to be sound and supports the level of employment land provision within the policy. We support the approach taken to unmet employment land needs and welcome the contribution to the unmet employment land needs of the Black Country (45.2 hectares of general employment land and a minimum of 67 hectares of employment land arising from the West Midlands Interchange (WMI)).

We particularly support the text which identifies the contribution from the WMI to be a minimum and the acknowledgement that this contribution may increase as other authorities confirm whether they require their proportion of strategic employment land from the WMI (as set out in 'West Midlands Strategic Rail Freight Interchange: Employment Issues Response Paper- Whose need will the SFRI serve? (Stantec, Feb 2021)).

Dudley forms part of the Black Country Functional Economic Market Area (FEMA) and has a functional economic relationship with several local authorities including South Staffordshire. The most recent Black Country Employment Development Needs Assessment (EDNA) 2023<sup>1</sup> provides an overall target figure for the Black Country FEMA from 2020 to 2041 of 470 hectares (ha) or 22.38ha per annum, which increases to 533ha

when taking into account the need for the replacement of employment land losses. An employment land supply of 380ha is identified within the Black Country at present, leaving a shortfall of 153ha.

Offers of employment land from local authorities with functional economic links including Shropshire (30ha) and South Staffordshire (112.2ha) which are being progressed through local plan reviews will serve to reduce this evidenced shortfall. Around 11ha of the Black Country FEMA shortfall would remain based on the contributions identified to date.

It is noted the draft Statements of Common Ground (which form part of the evidence base to the Publication Local Plan) are to be updated and Dudley MBC will continue to engage with South Staffordshire DC under the Duty to Cooperate. We would note that the current drafts in relation to employment land identify that Stafford Borough Council do not require their WMI strategic employment land share (of 8 hectares). As per the text within Policy DS4, we would expect these 8 hectares to be added to meeting the unmet employment needs of the Black Country (to be confirmed via updated draft Statements of Common Ground).

#### **Gypsy and Travellers Provision**

Dudley MBC considers the policy to be sound and supports the level of gypsy and traveller pitches provision within the policy, and the approach taken to identifying future site supply.

It is noted the draft Statements of Common Ground (which form part of the evidence base to the Publication Local Plan) are to be updated and Dudley MBC will continue to engage with South Staffordshire DC under the Duty to Cooperate. Discussions to date confirm Dudley MBC is unable to contribute towards the unmet needs of South Staffordshire for gypsy and traveller sites. This is based upon a review of site availability in Dudley MBC to date, as set out in Dudley's recent Local Plan Regulation 18 consultation and associated evidence base (November-December 2023).
